Labor Issue

Gun Rights Issue

Contest Details

Dates: April 1 – April 30th

Eligible Contestants: All 16, 17, & 18 year olds that reside in the respective county and are between those ages during the month of April. Anyone with a birthday in April turning 16 or turning 19 will qualify.

Contest Format: Four Part Short Essay – 300 words or less per question. Title sections do not count. No mixing and matching.

Eligible Counties: Allen, Auglaize, Champaign, Darke, Logan, Mercer, Shelby

Deadline for Submission: April 30th, 2016

Judging: The judges will receive your essay with no name. Each county has a judge assigned to that specific county.
